

## Bachelor of Arts In Architecture

The Bachelor of Arts in Architecture is a four-year, undergraduate degree program in which students explore the many factors that shape our built environment. The program provides a liberal arts foundation in the study of architecture that covers spatial reasoning, aesthetics, political and economic structures, socio-cultural influences, urbanism, landscape, construction, building technologies, and ecology. It gives students the opportunity to focus their studies through a sequence of courses that allows concentration in one of three areas:

- History and Theory
- Materials and Making
- Sustainable Technologies

### ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

#### DIRECT ADMISSION FOR FRESHMAN

Students accepted to the UW who indicate Architecture as the preferred major on the freshman application are considered for direct admission to the Department of Architecture's BA programs. Students must complete prerequisite courses sophomore year.

#### SOPHOMORE-YEAR ADMISSION

Sophomore-year admission is open to UW freshmen that will have completed at least 45 credits by the time of admission into the program. The application deadline for sophomore admission is the first Monday of spring quarter. Students must complete prerequisite courses sophomore year.

#### JUNIOR-YEAR ADMISSION

Junior year admission requires the completion of ARCH prerequisites and a minimum of 90 credits. The application deadline for junior admission is the first Monday of spring quarter. Admission decisions are based on an applicant's academic performance and potential, extent and quality of relevant experience, and personal motivation. Completion of prerequisite requirements does not guarantee admission.

#### TRANSFER ADMISSION

Transfer students may apply for admission to the program at the beginning of the sophomore year or at the beginning of the junior year. Application deadlines are the same as for Sophomore or Junior year Admission. A separate application is required for UW admission.

Before graduation, students must also complete two Writing (W) courses for a minimum total of 10 credits, and 3 credits of Diversity (DIV) course(s). These courses may also count toward any other requirement, except the 5-credit English composition requirement. Students should complete some or all of these requirements prior to admission to the Architecture program.

### MAJOR REQUIREMENTS

Courses that begin in the third year include Core courses, Area of Concentration (AOC) selectives, Architecture electives, College of Built Environment electives, and upper division electives.
