## BACHELOR OF ARTS IN ARCHITECTURAL DESIGN / Pre-Professional

The Department of Architecture offers a Bachelor of Arts with a major in Architectural Design for students who are interested in the professional practice of architecture. This program allows for advanced standing into most Masters of Architecture programs.

### APPLICATION

Complete applications are due the first day of UW's spring quarter for entrance in autumn quarter only. The application includes: transcripts, DARS report, a personal statement, personal resume, and samples of creative work. Admission decisions are based on an applicant's academic performance and potential, extent and quality of relevant experience, and personal motivation. Completion of prerequisite requirements does not guarantee admission.

### ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Junior year admission requires the completion of ARCH prerequisites and a minimum of 90 credits, including planned completion of all General Education & Areas of Inquiry before beginning the major. The application deadline for admission is the first Monday of spring quarter.

### TRANSFER ADMISSION

Transfer students may apply for admission to the major. The application and admission processes are the same as those for current UW students, however a separate application is required for UW admission. ### DUAL DEGREE WITH CONSTRUCTION MANAGEMENT

The department offers a 5-year dual BA in Architectural Design / BS in Construction Management with the Department of Construction Management. Students who are admitted to the ARCH Design major are eligible to apply for the dual degree during their first year in the ARCH Design major. They do not need to complete the BS in CM prerequisites for admission or degree completion. Students will complete the 2-year ARCH Design degree and add an additional academic year to finish the dual degree. - Gray indicates courses that are taught only in particular quarters and must be taken in sequence. All other selective and elective courses are offered in multiple quarters and may be shifted to other quarters depending on student's interest and course offerings
- "Upper Division Electives" are any 300- or 400-level classes offered at UW (these can also be used to complete requirements a minor in another area of interest)
- Studying abroad within the ARCH DESIGN major is possible, usually during Autumn (Rome) or Spring (varying cities) quarter of the final year in the program. Offerings are subject to department availability. A typical ARCH study abroad program includes one 6-cr studio (usually ARCH 400 or 402), a 3cr History/Theory selective, and 6 credits of upper division ARCH coursework. Otherwise, students can study abroad via other UW programs in summer quarter. Inquire with the Study Abroad office.
