## BACHELOR OF ARTS IN ARCHITECTURE STUDIES

### EXPLORING ARCHITECTURE STUDIES

The Department of Architecture offers a Bachelor of Arts in Architectural Studies for students who are interested in architecture as a cultural, social, and technological field of study.

The Bachelor of Arts in Architectural Studies is a four-year, undergraduate degree program in which students explore the many factors that shape our built environment. The program provides a liberal studies approach to the study of architecture. It gives students the opportunity to focus their studies through a sequence of courses that allows concentration in one of three areas: History/Theory, Materials & Making, or Sustainable Development.

### ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

#### DIRECT ADMISSION FOR FRESHMAN

Students accepted to the UW who indicate Architecture as the preferred major on the freshman application are considered for direct admission to the Architecture Studies major. These students may begin the prerequisite ARCH courses once they complete 45 credits of their General Education / Area of Inquiry requirements (usually the Sophomore year)

#### JUNIOR-YEAR ADMISSION

Junior year admission requires the completion of ARCH prerequisites and a minimum of 90 credits, including planned completion of all General Education & Areas of Inquiry before beginning the major. The application deadline for junior admission is the first Monday of spring quarter. Admission decisions are based on an applicant's academic performance and potential, extent and quality of relevant experience, and personal motivation. Completion of prerequisite requirements does not guarantee admission.

#### TRANSFER ADMISSION

Transfer students may apply for admission to the program at the beginning of the sophomore year or at the beginning of the junior year. Application deadlines are the same as for Sophomore or Junior year Admission. A separate application is required for UW admission.
